Academic and Training Updates

During the January–April 2026 session, the College successfully implemented 45 active CBET programmes across Levels 3 to 6, covering Modules 1, 2, and 3 in line with TVET CDACC requirements.

- **Enrolment:** Trainee enrolment reached 431, reflecting growing confidence in the institution's training quality

- **Assessments:** Three CATs and practicals completed. CDACC verification team reviewed Portfolios of Evidence and commended the institution's systems and compliance.
- **External Exams:** 131 candidates sat CDACC examinations starting 23rd March 2026. Basic Units concluded smoothly on 27th March with scripts returned promptly. Core Units ended 10th April under official supervision with no incidents.
- **Infrastructure Enhancements:** A major highlight was the **launch of the upgraded ICT laboratory in February 2026** by the Area MP, **Hon. Felix Odwuor**. The facility, supported by Safaricom M-Pesa Foundation sponsorship, now features high-performance computers, an interactive smartboard, surround speakers, printers, LAN, server room, CCTV, and fiber internet. This modernization has significantly elevated digital learning, supported our programmes, and boosted student satisfaction. The upgrade aligns with national efforts to equip TVET institutions with modern tools.





Research and Innovation Spotlight

The College continues to strengthen its research and innovation capacity as preparations intensify for the upcoming National Research and Knowledge Management Competition scheduled for May 2026. Plans are underway to establish a Robotics and Automation Club to foster interest in AI, mechatronics, and emerging technologies, as well as to host institutional research symposia and skills expos.

Strategic Alliances and Prior Learning Initiatives

The College has expanded its industry partnerships across Automotive, Hospitality, and Fashion sectors. Collaborations with organizations such as motor industry firms, hotels, and textile companies will support dual training, with trainees expected to report for industrial exposure in May 2026.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) continues to gain momentum, with progress made in strengthening processes and awareness. Notably, the Electrical Department successfully registered a candidate for RPL assessment under the guidance of a qualified practitioner.

These initiatives reinforce the College's commitment to flexible learning pathways and industry-relevant skills development.

Student welfare remained a key priority during the session, with various activities aimed at holistic development:

Guidance and Counselling - Mentorship sessions including Boy/Girl talks focusing on life skills, career development, and wellness

- Cultural Day featuring traditional dances, modelling, public speaking, and creative performances





- Prayer Day for CDACC candidates to enhance spiritual and psychological preparedness for exams

Looking ahead to the next session, the College aims to:

- Strengthen enrolment through targeted recruitment strategies
- Expand research and innovation capacity
- Enhance student support services, including the establishment of a Student Wellness Centre
- Deepen industry partnerships and increase opportunities for industrial exposure
